GRF Overview

Global Relations Forum (GRF), founded in 2009 with the support of prominent Turkish leaders in business, government and academia, is an independent, nonpartisan membership association committed to being a platform for engaging, informing, and stimulating its members and all interested individuals in all matters related to international affairs and global issues.

GRF intends to advance a culture that rewards the fertile tension between passion for intellectual diversity and dedication to innovative and objective synthesis. It nurtures uninhibited curiosity, analytic inquiry, rational debate, and constructive demeanor as the elemental constituents in all its endeavors. It contributes to the shared understanding of and aspiration for humanity's path to peace, prosperity, and progress as an accessible, inclusive, and fair process for all.

GRF STUDIES

GRF undertakes policy work on current global challenges ranging from energy to trade, from security to rule of law, synthesizing the contributions of former ministers, diplomats, corporate chairpersons and CEO's, university presidents and prominent academics. GRF's members also work with distinguished individuals in other countries, from the US to the EU, from the Russian Federation to India, to tackle international challenges that threaten the global order. These initiatives to strengthen global cooperative ties are in the tradition of similar institutions in other parts of the world that share the overarching objective of informing, enriching and shaping global policy-making processes.

Task Forces

GRF Task Forces are independent commissions that bring together accomplished individuals to deliberate and reach a consensus on complex topics in foreign policy. Task Forces seek to demarcate the relatively stable long-term trends and structural certainties from the unruly dynamics of complexity and uncertainty and to make balanced judgements on matters that involve medium to long-term uncertainty.

Track-II Studies

GRF has initiated Track-II studies with its global counterparts. The objective is to enrich the dialogue between Turkey and other countries and to contribute to foreign policy processes and public diplomacy. It is assumed that this continued exchange will help lay the foundation for new thinking, even a new language.

GRF-Carnegie Moscow Center "Turkey-Russia Relations"

In 2013, GRF and the Carnegie Moscow Center established a Working Group dedicated to exploring the potential for regional cooperation between Turkey and Russia. The Working Group, comprised of senior government officials, diplomats, military officers, and leading experts from both countries, was tasked with developing a constructive framework on how cooperation between the two countries could be practically advanced. The Group presented its consensus policy report to the public in October 2014.

GRF-Ananta Aspen Center "Turkey-India Forum"

In 2015, given the growing importance of India as a global actor and the prospects of Indian-Turkish cooperation, GRF decided to initiate Track-II studies with Indian counterparts. The 4th India-Turkey Forum held on March 28, 2015 paved the way for the establishment of a Track-II study with the Ananta Aspen Centre. In 2016, with the 5th Turkey-India Forum, GRF officially took over the co-leadership of the initiative with its counterpart, Ananta Aspen Centre. Moving forward, GRF members will constitute the Turkish delegation in the Forum.

International Projects

GRF has also launched international projects, which involve the establishment of issue-based partnerships with organizations from around the world whose values, goals and areas of focus coincide with those of GRF. These

GRF COMMUNITIES

As a much younger institution compared to its peers around the globe, GRF is also concerned about a relatively new and distinct challenge of policy thinking which reflects the current milieu of fast-paced change. Developing policies that are not easily frustrated by frequent shifts in the global context is a new and overwhelming challenge for the policy community. GRF invests in communities of young thinkers as the main driver of its search for long-term thinking and resilient policy processes. The presumption is that young thinkers are better suited to this intellectual effort as they are less conditioned by current habits and paradigms of traditional analysis.

GRF Young Scholars Seminars

GRF conducts seminar programs for GRF Young Scholars, selected annually from leading universities in Turkey and abroad. The programs aim to instill in its participants an appreciation for the fruitful interaction and synthesis of different opinions, a fundamental premise of GRF.

GRF Young Academics Program

With this program, GRF aims to establish an expanding global community of young academics who, in their policy deliberations focus on global systemic issues. The intellectual capital accumulating as a result of this program will hopefully make a valuable contribution to national and global policy-making in the coming decades.

This program admits young academics who are currently pursuing their doctorate studies or have completed their Ph.D. within the last three years. The program culminates in a policy paper written by the candidate and published by GRF.

GRF Young Professionals Program

Since its foundation, GRF has been directing its resources to enrich Turkey's contribution to the global agenda. The GRF Young Professionals Program was launched to build GRF's practical competence by incorporating young decision-makers into GRF studies. The program is targeted at young professionals who are equipped with the resolve, background, and experience to contribute to the future of Turkey and the world.

GRF Young Global Program

Launched in 2015, GRF's Young Global Program is a unique thought exercise that engages young individuals of the world to reflect on the main constructs/concepts/institutions of human life, imagine their possible paths of evolution over the next two centuries, and identify core values and structures that we wish to preserve in the era of rapid transformation that lies ahead of us.

The participants of the program are individuals who have successfully completed GRF's Young Scholars and Young Scholars Abroad programs, and international participants from the leading universities of the world who were nominated by Young Scholars.
